In 1982, Jackie won a Grammy Award for song of the year when she co-wrote the number #1 hit song, "Bette Davis Eyes". In addition to her honors and distinctions in the music industry, Jackie also carved out a successful showbiz career and appeared in a number of popular TV shows and film series during the 1960's, '70's and 80's. Recognized by her soulful voice and heart-felt lyrics, Jackie DeShannon is without a doubt one of the most influential female artists and entertainers of all time.
